Holiday takeout or dine-in on the table

Restaurants offer a wide range of Easter and Passover specials

he holidays continue to look different this year as more restaurants offer takeout meals for your celebrations. Whether you're celebrating Passover or Easter, we've got you covered with this list of dine-in or takeout specials from eateries across Dallas-Fort Worth.

AL BIERNAT'S offers an a la carte Easter brunch available for curbside pickup or dine-in on April 4 from Illa... to 3 p.m. Dishes include strawberry-topped pancakes, crabcake Benediet, chicken and waffles, beef tenderloin, prime rib, sea bass, butternut squash macaroni and cheese, coconut cream pie and carrot cake. Prices vary, Two Dallas locations: 42TO ak Land Ave, 214-220; 525 Spring Valley Road, 972-239-3400.

BLUE MESA GRILL offers a to-go family pack that serves four people for \$100. The brunch package includes red chile-glazed harn with pineapple-mango salsa, beef brisket and tomatillo chicken tacos, the migas scrambler, biscuits and sausage gravy, Southwest meacroni and cheese, assorted sides and desserts. BONEFISH offers a mahi and shrimp family takeout bundle April 2-4 for \$49.90. The package serves up to five people and includes a choice of house or Caesar salad, sauce, family-style sides like graific mashed potatoes and seasonal vegetables, fresh bread with pesto, and cookles. The restaurant also has \$18.90 seasonal fish didshes willable for takeout and direl-in on Fridays through April 2 like Rockefeller "Butterfish," featuring Alaskan black cod topped with creamy spinach and jumbo



Herd and Hearth, at the Westin Stonebriar in Frisco, has oak-smoked rack of la chicken with lemon-thyme butter as another main dish option. This year, resta as pandemic restrictions ease, but many have well-adapted takeout service for
